Citizenship

Citizenship is an important part of a student's learning and an effective classroom environment. Students should be able to follow the expectations and norms within a society and the school. The classroom citizenship expectations are listed below.

Respect

- Student dresses, speaks, and acts in accordance with district policy.
- Student uses appropriate language and keeps hands to themselves.
- Student shows integrity by doing what they say they will do.
- Student is honest and trustworthy.
- Student shows respect for learning by listening and following directions.

Positive Participation

- Student follows through with their individual responsibilities and contributes to a more positive experience for others.
- Student is an active participant in the activities related to the lesson.
- Student is inclusive and work to make all students feel welcomed and appreciated.
- Student is proactive in resolving conflicts and overcoming difficulties within groups.

Work Ethic

- Student sets regular routines for review and study and gets the outside help required to be successful in class (tutoring, study groups, asking teacher, etc.).
- Student submits completed assignments on or before the established deadline.

Organization

- Student organizes work so that notes and other materials are easily accessible.
- Student is neat and thorough when completing assignments
- Student arrives to class on time, has all the necessary materials and is ready to learn.
- Student uses class time wisely.

Citizenship Mark

The Citizenship Mark appears on the student's report card and is defined as follows:

Outstanding

• Student demonstrates leadership abilities, often coaches their team and consistently displays exemplary citizenship as listed below.

Satisfactory

• Student participates as a team member, engages in learning activities and displays good citizenship as listed below.

Not Satisfactory

• Student minimally participates, rarely seeks assistance, is infrequently prepared for class and lacks fulfillment of the citizenship expectations listed below.
